
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

"When I was a teenager, I really struggled with internalised biphobia, what seems to be a universal experience; Am I really bi? Is this just a phase? In high school, there were very negative attitudes towards bisexuals. We were seen as promiscuous, fakes, desperately seeking attention. Because of the stigma, I just didn't want to admit that I was attracted to women." "People see bisexuality as fickle and they find that threatening. I've had friends make comments like, "If you're bi, that means I'm in danger, and so is my girlfriend." "I kept guiet for years. I looked for community online, but hid the truth from my family. Biphobia keeps us in the closet." "I never know if I am able to come out at work, and what will happen if I come out? Also sometimes I have internalised biphobia and think I am straight or lesbian.
